Most probably you have heard that the Eighth International Symposium on Tools and Methods of Competitive Engineering (TMCE 2010) will be held in Ancona, Italy, from 12th to 16th April, 2010. The previous TMCE Symposia were held in Budapest (H), Manchester (UK), Delft (NL), Wuhan (CN), Lausanne (CH), Ljubljana (SLO), and Izmir (TR). TMCE 2010 is jointly organized by the Delft University of Technology, Delft, the Netherlands, and the Università Politecnica delle Marche, Ancona, Italy. to register for the Symposium with a participation fee. However, as in the previous years, we are pleased to offer a reduced registration fee for our special speakers, which will be 520 euro.

We kindly ask you to inform us whether you can accept our invitation for the panel discussion. If your answer is affirmative, please send us a short description of your view and opinion on the topic of discussion in about 300 words. We also kindly request you to send us your brief curriculum vitae/resume in 250 words, and a passport size photo that will be published on the TMCE 2010 Symposium's web site. Later on you will receive from us all necessary information about the preparation for the panel discussion.
